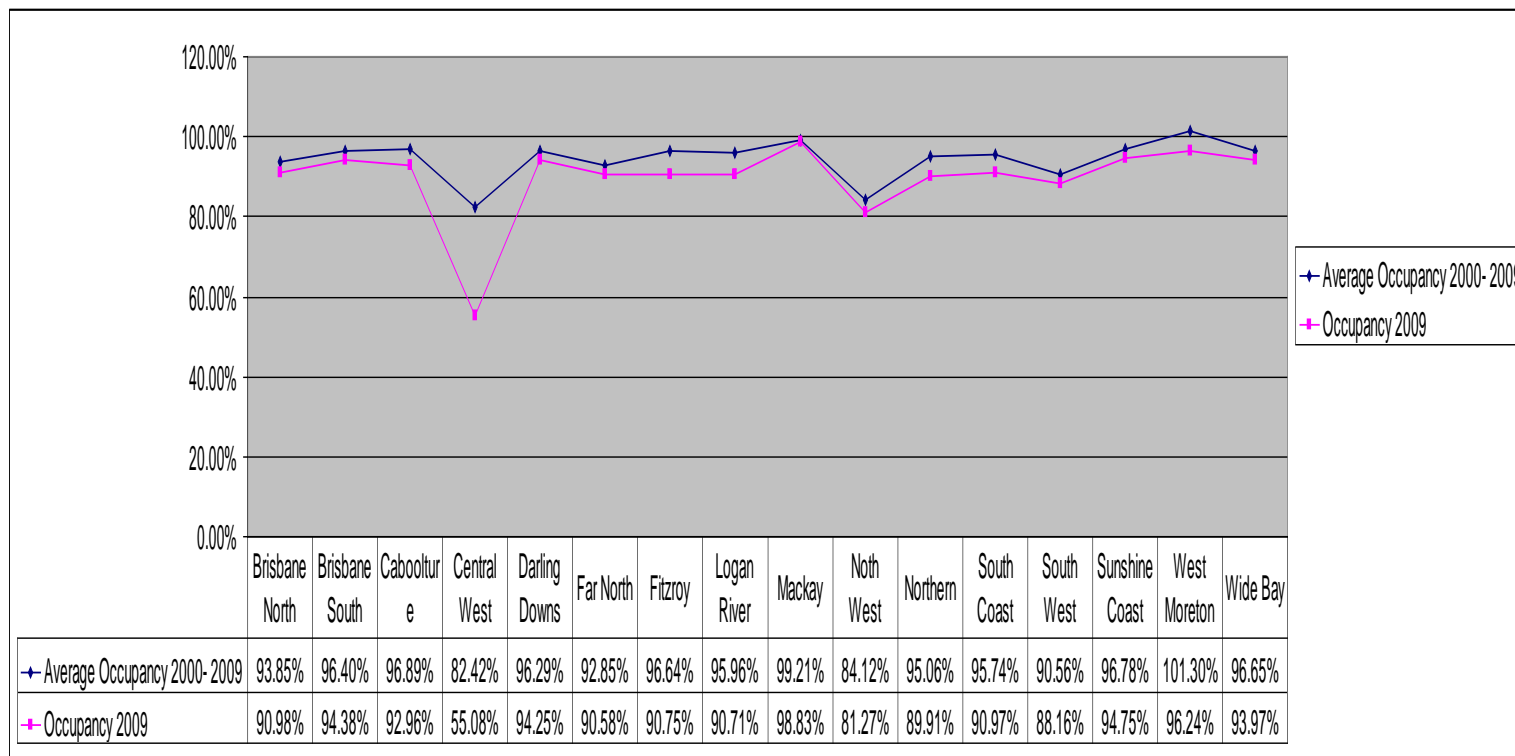

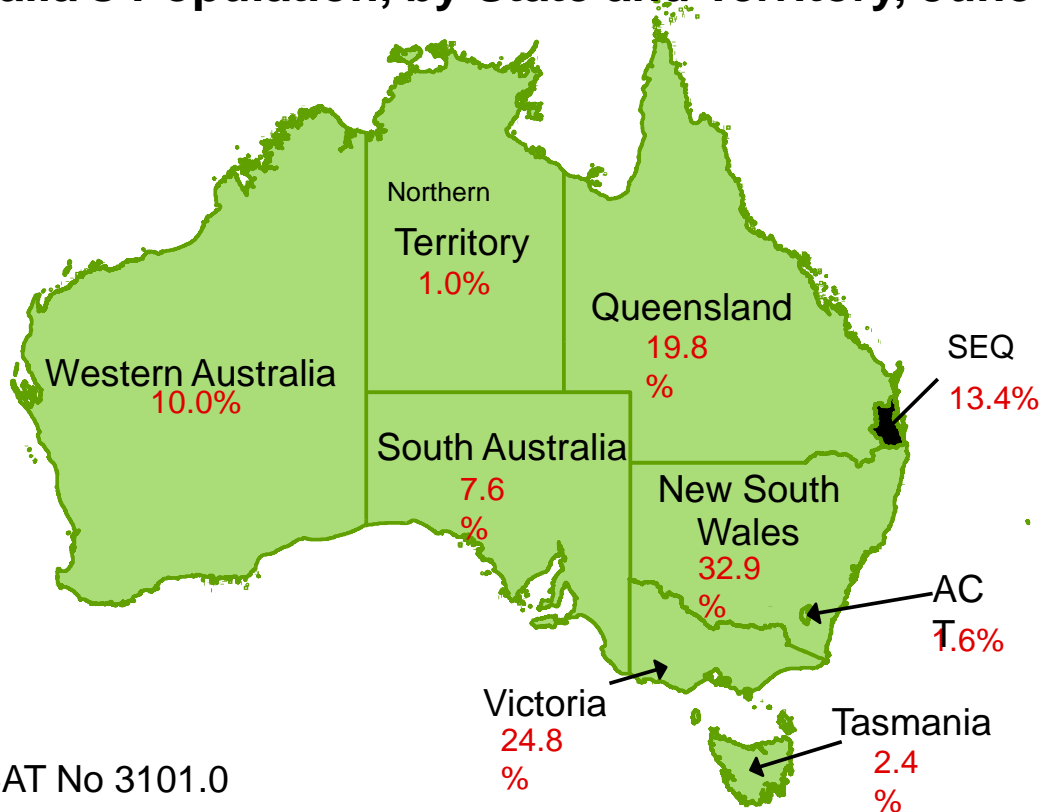


Residential Care Occupancy Rates





Australia's Population, by State and Territory, June 2006

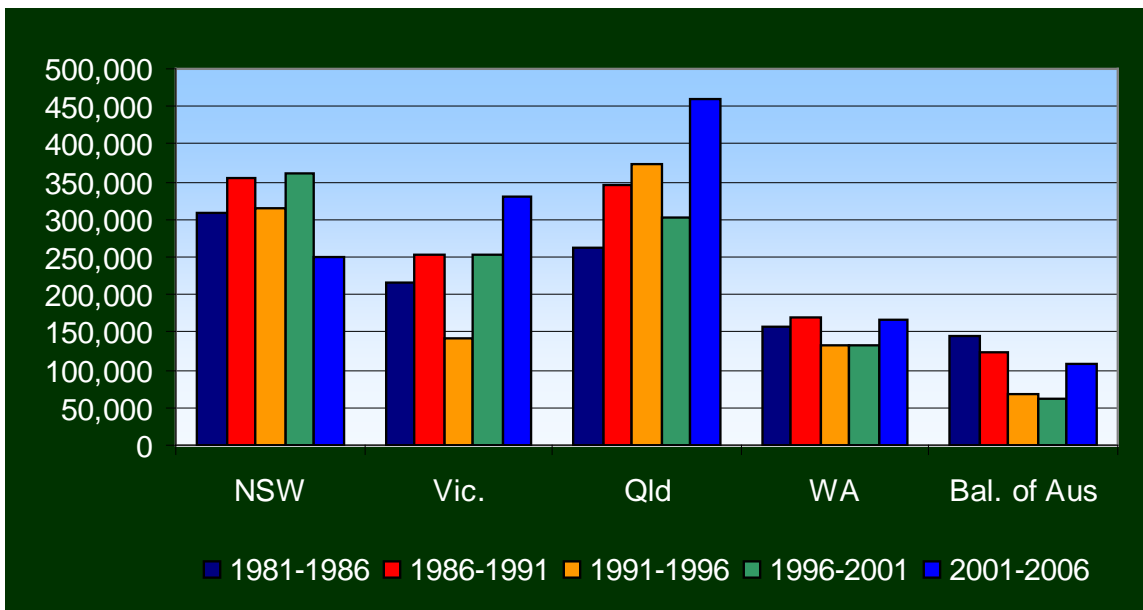

Queensland – Grows More Than NSW or Victoria (year ending 31st December 2006)

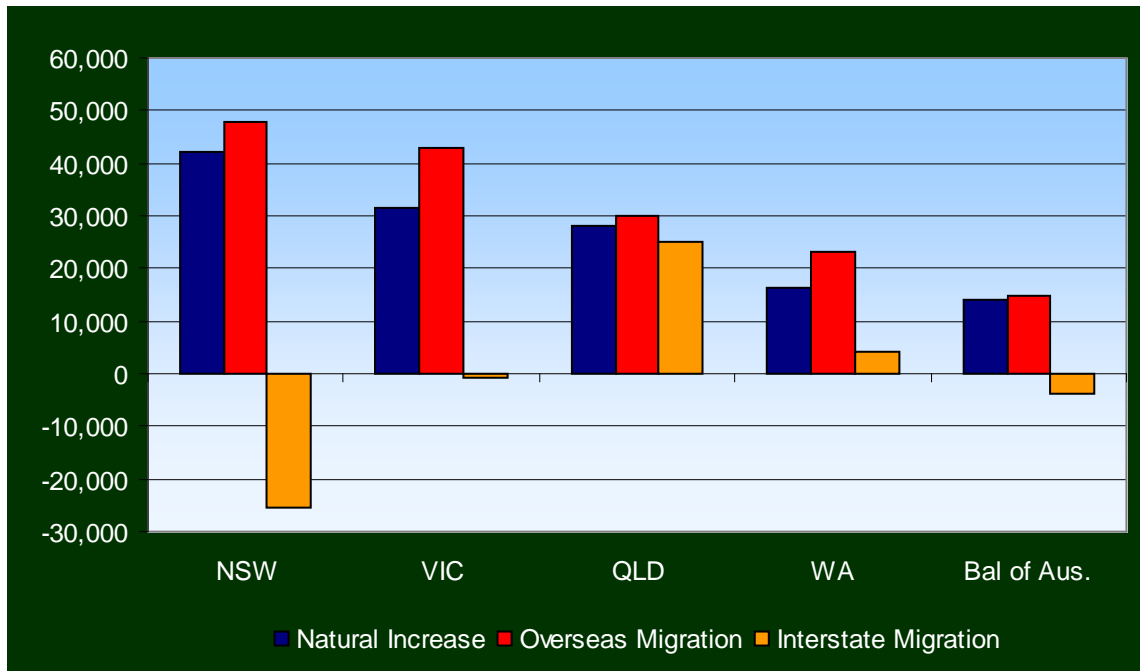

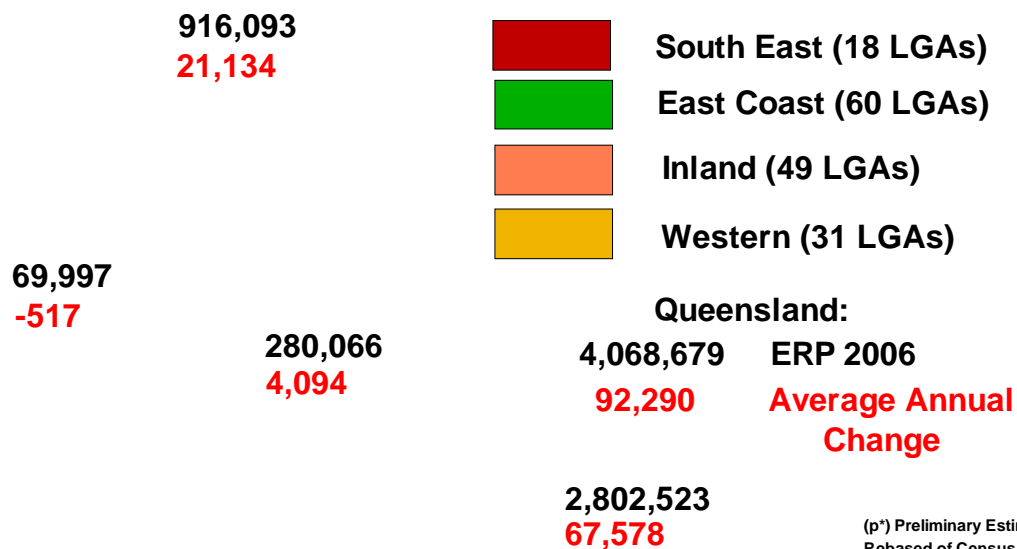
What is Driving Queensland's Growth? (year ending 31st December 2006)

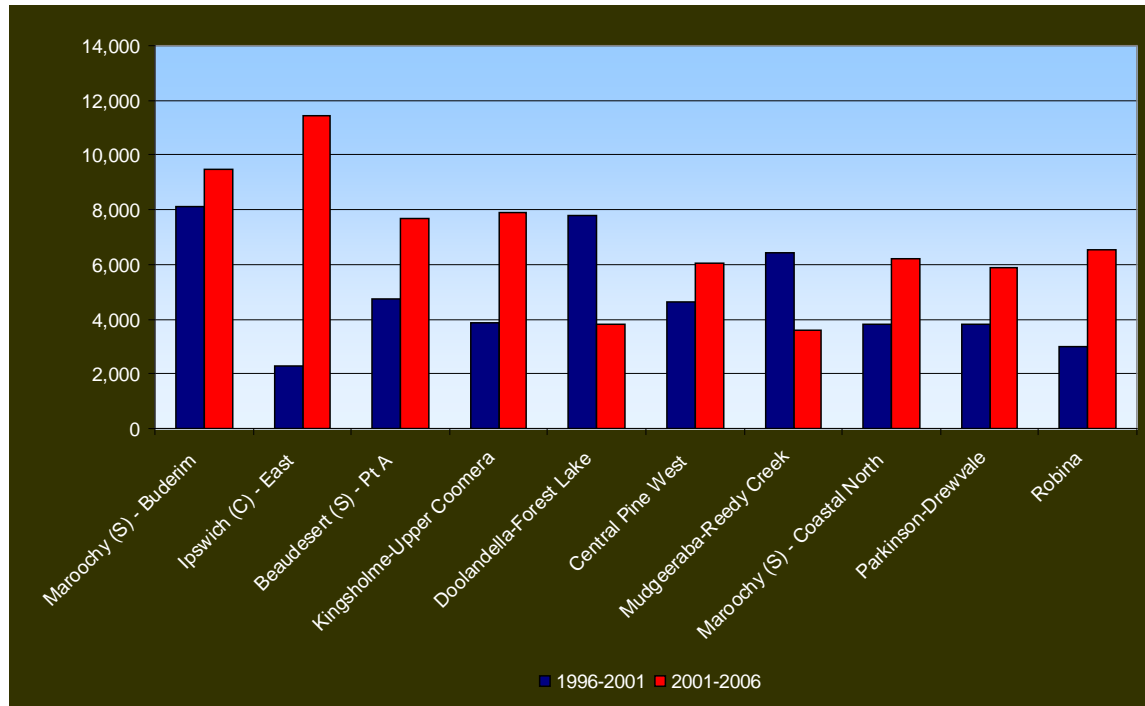

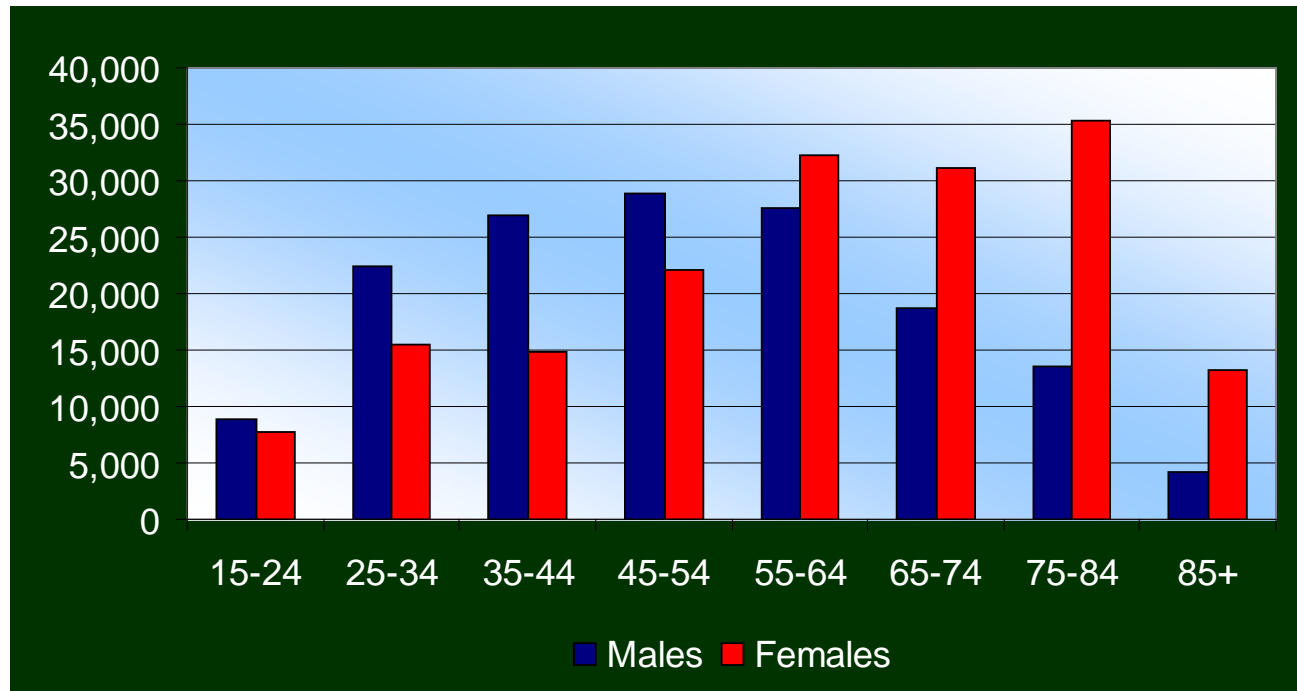

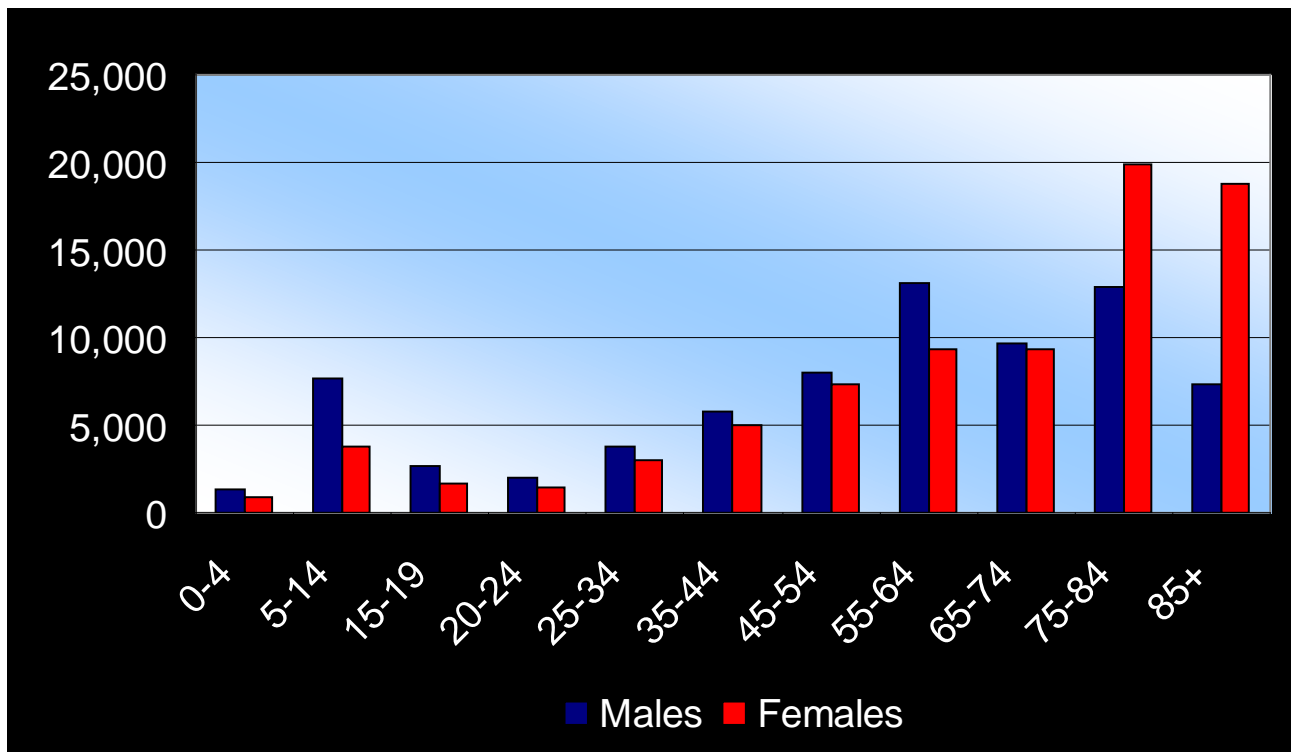
People Living Alone, Queensland, 2006

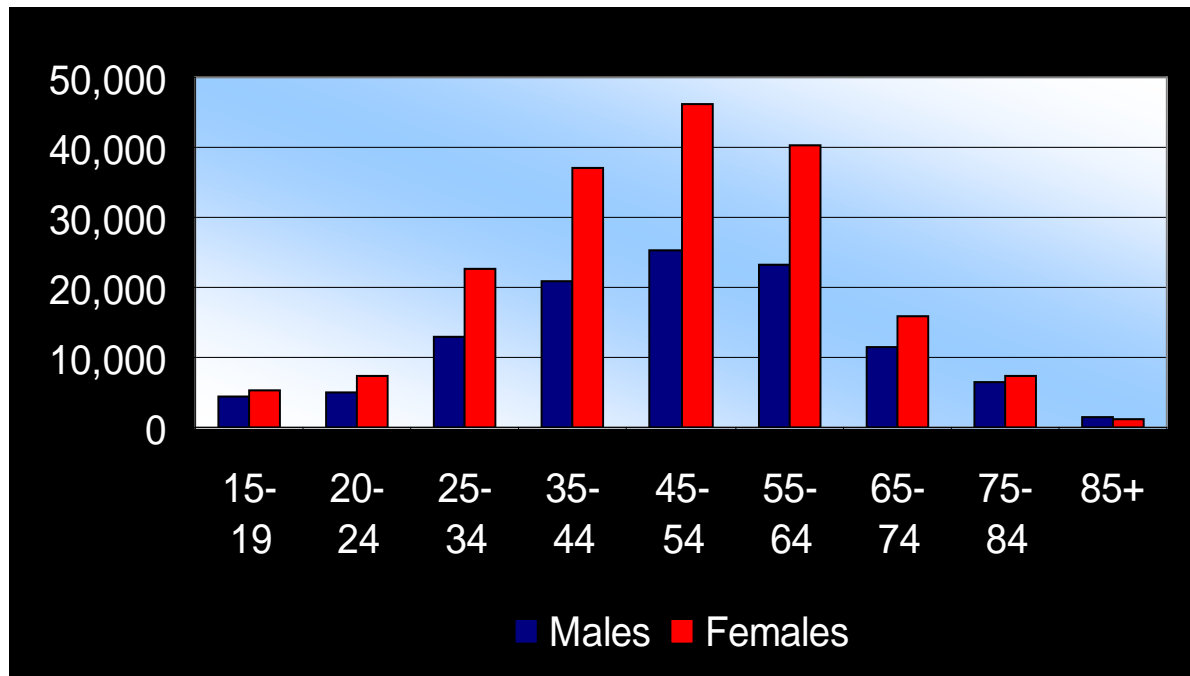
People requiring assistance with Core Activities, Queensland, 2006

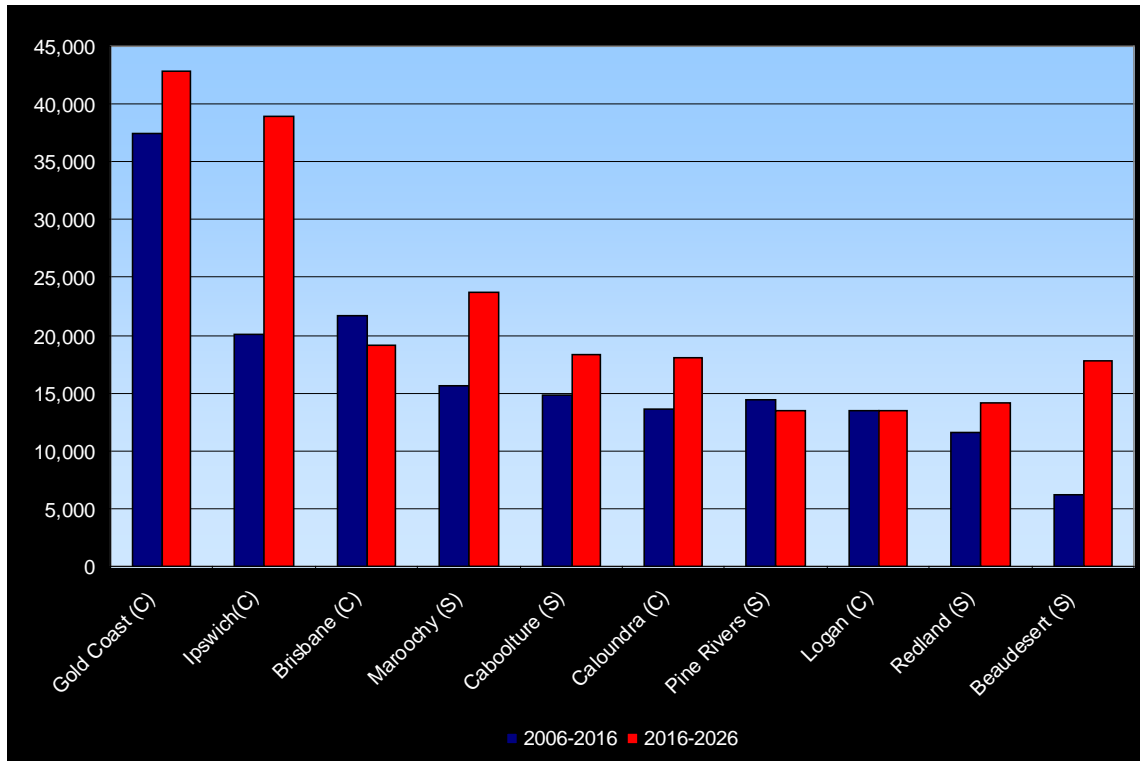
People Providing Unpaid Assistance to Someone with a Disability, Queensland, 2006

Largest Projected Growth in > 65s

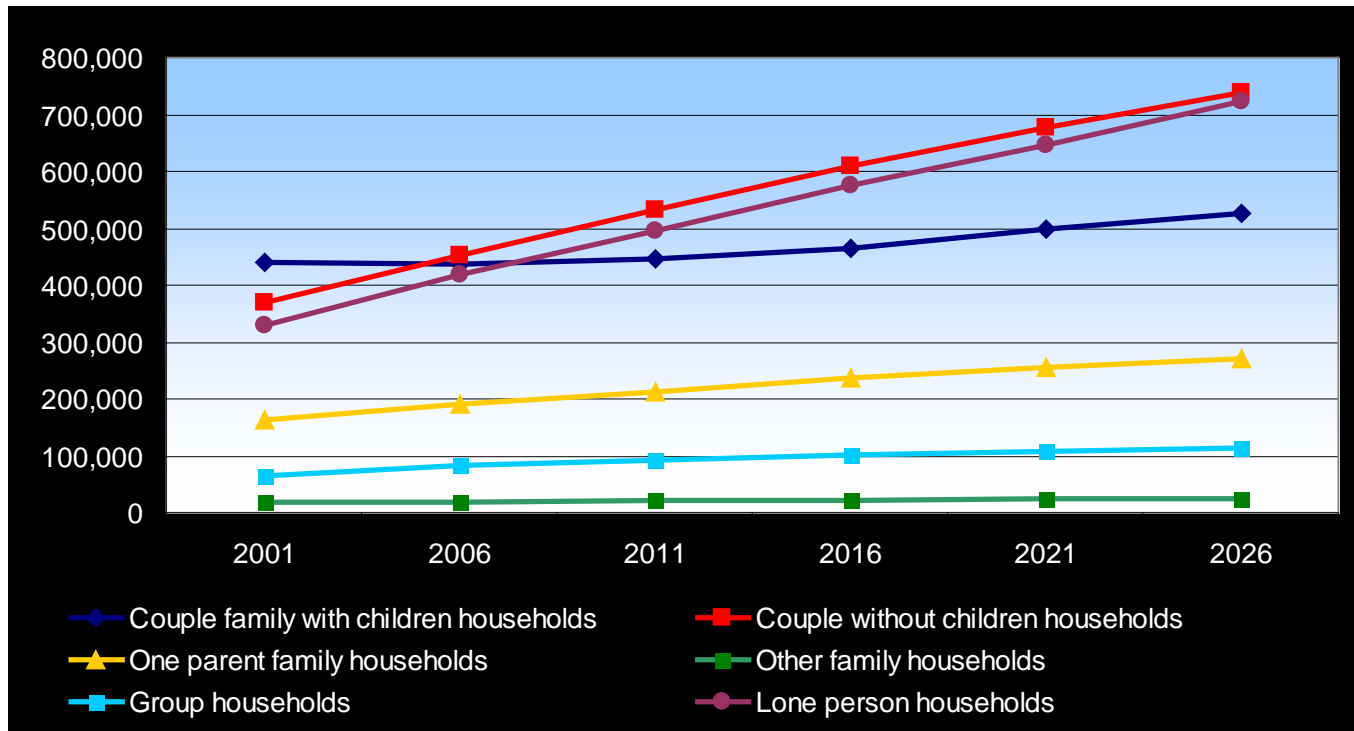

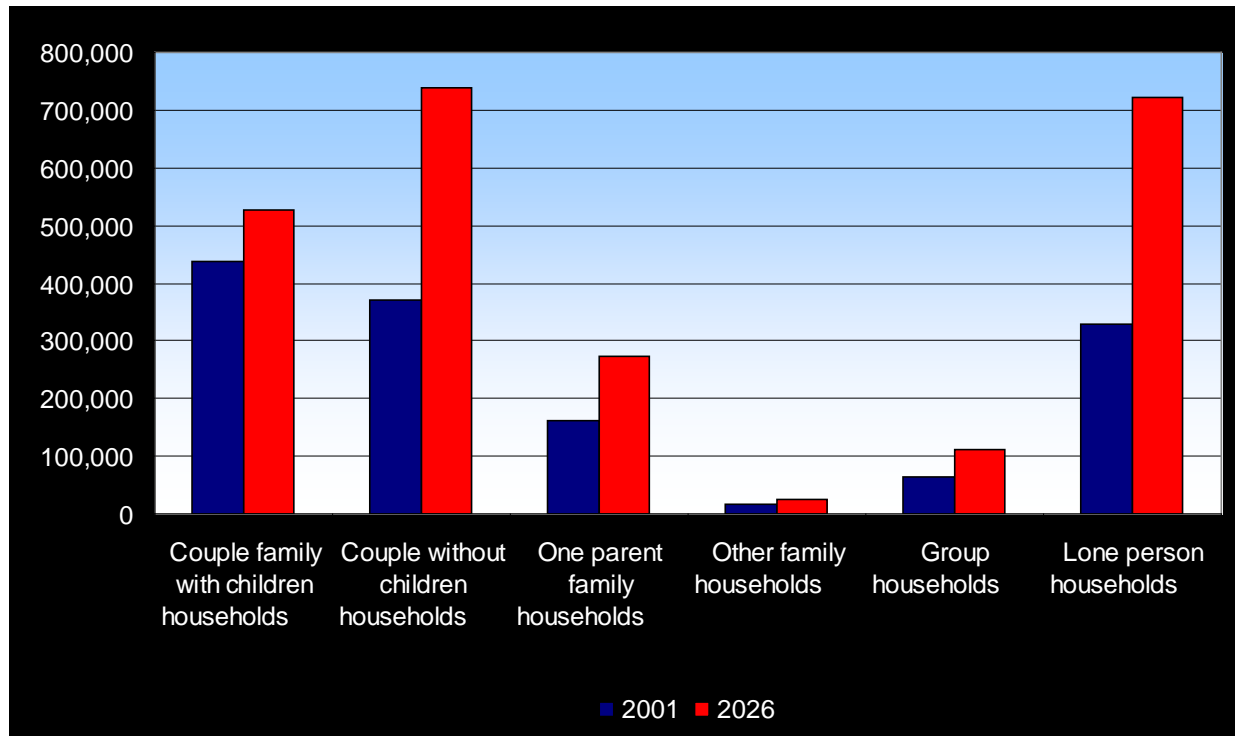
Numbers of Households will Grow, but different types will grow faster than others...
